#### Strategies

The cities of Berlin and Washington contain many monuments, museums, memorials, and public buildings, of which many are unique as monuments to the history and culture in their countries. Others are similar in their purpose and meaning to each nation. **Teacher Resource 13, "Public Buildings"** provides background information on the following "parallel" sites in the two cities **(Transparency 17–17G "Public Buildings")** and their significance. Information on the sites in Washington are readily available in textbooks and the school media center.
